We selected Banyumas as our study site, because Banyumas has the highest number of elderly in the province and most of them live in rural area, so it is appropriate with our study objective that focusing on the issue of elderly health condition in rural area in Indonesia. We have added this information in methods section. The characteristics of Banyumas has similarity with Indonesian context, however we could not generalize the results to whole situation of Indonesia, but it is only a case study in limited area that represents part of the territory of Indonesia. We have also provided the map of the study area.

We thank the reviewer for this suggestion. It is true that having one limitation will be different from having more than one limitations regarding elderly physical functioning. For providing the information we have added the distribution of limitation in the paper (Figure 3), but we do not apply it in the multivariate analysis, because for numerical scale dependent variable, linear regression would be appropriate if data is normally distributed.

9. What are the chronic diseases included in this study? The chronic illness should be included by the disease, as each disease will have a different effect on physical functioning.

Chronic diseases included in the study are hypertension, diabetes, tuberculosis, asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary diseases, heart diseases, liver diseases, stroke, cancer, arthritis, high cholesterol, prostate, kidney diseases, stomach disorder, mental disorder and memory disorder, but after data collection, there is no case of liver diseases, cancer, kidney diseases and memory disorder. We have added the distribution of the chronic diseases in the

Figure 2. However, the disease data can be multiple, meaning that one person can have more than one disease, so it is not suitable to analyze each disease independently. This study only focuses on general picture about the contribution of chronic diseases to physical functioning. Future study has an opportunity to conduct this analysis.
