Overall, the manuscript is well written and easy to follow but the manuscript is needed to be edited in some points as mentioned.

Additional Questions:

1. Originality: Does the paper contain new and significant information adequate to justify publication?: The study attempts to analyze the barriers in public policy articulated the importance and contribution of the SME sector to the Indonesian economy and discussed some challenges SMEs face in their operations. However, it had not been clearly articulated. One may ask what form of public policy is aimed at SMEs, why are those policies important to the SMEs with specific reference to the operations of SMEs in the creative economy? It will also be useful for one to know what is the creative economy in the first few paragraphs of the study.

2. 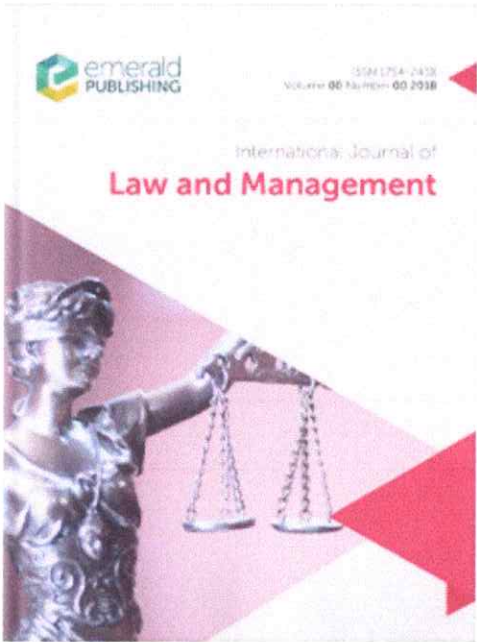

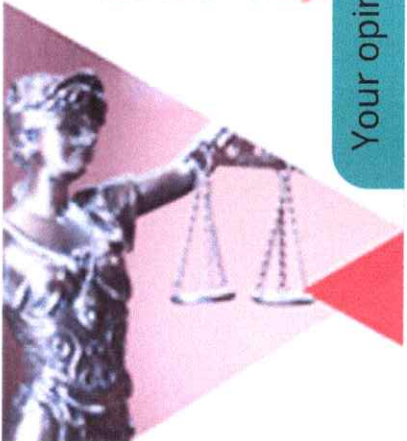

However, the core of the study which is barriers in public policy faced by SMEs had not been clearly articulated. One may ask what form of public policy is aimed at SMEs, why are those policies important to the SMEs with specific reference to the creative economy? How are those barriers expected to hamper the operations of SMEs in the creative economy? It will also be useful for one to know what is the creative economy in the first few paragraphs of the study.
2. Relationship to Literature: Does the paper demonstrate an adequate understanding of the relevant literature in the field and cite an appropriate range of literature sources? Is any significant work ignored? There was an extensive review of literature in the manuscript. However, there is no consistency with the in-text referencing. Some of the references appear quite old eg. Lipsky (1980). What is also of interest is the fact that the literature is not well organised. There are a number of subsections captured in the literature review section of the paper as "Creative Economy", "Policy Implementation Theory", "Capacity to Understand", "Commitment" etc. What is not clear is whether these reviews are theoretical reviews, conceptual, or even empirical reviews.
3. Methodology: Is the paper's argument built on an appropriate base of theory, concepts, or other ideas? Has the research or equivalent intellectual work on which the paper is based been well designed? Are the methods employed appropriate? Given the research approach, the sample of 15 people seem adequate for the study. What is not clear about the sample is the various categories of the creative industry that they might be coming from. It is important to know if all relevant players of the industry have been considered in this study, it is important to know how many is coming from each category. What is also not clear is whether the 15 includes the operators of SMEs. How many are they? The thematic analysis is also appropriate for this study.
Also, being a qualitative study, it important to know if all ethical considerations have been met in the data collection as well as the validity and reliability of the data collected.
4. Results: Are results presented clearly and analyzed appropriately? Do the conclusions adequately tie together the other elements of the paper? There is an adequate discussion and representation of the

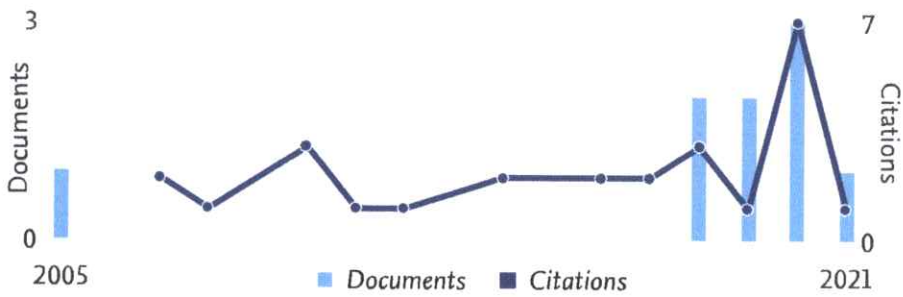
