[Editor's Comments] Associate Editor Comments to the Author:

The reviewers have found your submission interesting, but agree that it would take quite a bit of work to bring the paper

up to shape for publication in the Journal. We would thus require MAJOR REVISIONS if you would like to work on this more and re-submit for review once again in consideration of these comments:

The paper is largely descriptive, and needs to develop more a more sustained line of critical analysis.

In its present form, there are a number of inconsistencies and other areas in need of revision. In the first introductory paragraph, for example, this paper discusses rapid transformations of the post-New Order period, but without significant analytical depth in treating dynamics of political and economic power. Then the discussion rapidly shifts to a very different topic (local and national film production), but again rather superficially and with the citation of a number of references that do not seem particularly relevant.

In this way, we do not really get a sustained focus on 'poverty', which the writer had signalled would be the main focus of paper.

Here there also appear to be problems with the choice of films discussed in the paper, and the arguments that the author makes at several points, such as for example the under-developed argument that Siti is not actually about poverty, but rather primarily about gender. This then makes for a problematic comparison with the Turah.

The focus and specific points of comparison must then be made clear and in turn clarify the reasons for the films that the author chooses to discuss here.

In brief, the major problems that need to be addressed are:

- clarifying the relationship between the various subjects that come up in the paper
- A clearer and more substantial engagement (NOT SIMPLY CITING A WORK WITHOUT DISCUSSING IT) of relevant fields including both Film Studies and Southeast Asian Studies.
- More attention paid to the proofreading of the English prose.

Clarity of the problems questioned

Reviewer: 1

Clarity of the problems questioned: The key issues of the paper are clearly stated - Focusing on poverty in the films Turah and Siti, this paper presents innovative research into class issues in post-Suharto Indonesian cinema.

Reviewer: 2

Clarity of the problems questioned: After reading entirely from one to other paragraphs, it is difficult to find the exact problems attempted to be discussed. This paper seems to propose claims the significant discussion of poverty in the two films without any reason the uniqueness of both films among other films. Thus, in my opinion, this paper does not formulate clear problems questioned followed by its discussion.

Internal consistency

Reviewer: 1

Internal consistency: The weakness of the paper lies in the choice of films. The author mentions several times that 'Siti' is not actually about poverty, but about gender, with poverty as the background to the theme of gender. This makes the comparison feel one-sided, because the theme of Turah is poverty.

Reviewer: 2

Internal consistency: In my understanding, this paper seems inconsistent in explaining its topic. In the first introductory paragraph, for example, this paper discusses rapid transformation after new order era. Then, the writer cites other writer considering political and economical domination. In the next paragraph, the writer discusses something else namely local and central production of film in Indonesia. Again, the writer cites other irrelevant references. This also happens in the next paragraphs.

Without exploring poverty, suddenly the writer states that poverty is the focus of paper. From this statement, this paper discusses more on Krisna Sen argumentations. Then, no detail information on the poverty within both movies.

Readers could easily find inconsistency until the conclusion. Thus, in terms of internal consistency, I prefer to recommend the author to make major revision and reconceptualise the relevant idea from one to other paragraphs.

Appropriateness of literatures

Reviewer: 1

Appropriateness of literatures: There is a reasonable range of literature.

Reviewer: 2

Appropriateness of literatures: Most of the references cited in this paper are relevant. However, I can easily find that the citation is written without further discussion and rather adjusting the paper's arguments.

Originality of contribution

Reviewer: 1

Originality of contribution: The paper would make an original contribution, but in its current form is not yet suitable for publication. The paper is largely descriptive, with little real analysis. A major revision is required.

Reviewer: 2

Originality of contribution: In term of originality, the case discussed by this paper is a recent phenomenon in Indonesia. It can contribute to the field of film studies regarding the form of poverty or its category, from the cultural studies within Indonesian or Southeast Asian studies, other narratives such as works of literature often portrait a similar or relevant discussed topic.

Review of manuscript: Two Dark Stories from Rural Rural Indonesia: Comparing the Poverty in Turah (2016) and Siti (2014)

The weakness of the paper lies in the choice of films. The author mentions several times that 'Siti' is not actually about poverty, but about gender, with poverty as the background to the theme of gender. This makes the comparison feel onesided, because the theme of Turah is poverty.

The paper would make an original contribution, but in its current form is not yet suitable for publication. The paper is largely descriptive, with little real analysis. A major revision is required, with a focus on the following:

- 1. If the author wishes to include 'Siti' in the comparative study, then there must be a rigorous analysis, drawing on available literature of how gender and poverty are linked in Indonesia. To what extent is poverty in Indonesia gendered? 2.Greater attention needs to be given to the social context and settings of both films.
- 3. The statement 'The theme of the compared films in this paper belongs to "the individual vs the group" needs further explanation.
- 4. The reference to Althusser's idea of 'interpellation' or 'hailing' is pertinent. I think this should be expanded so that it becomes one of the theoretical underpinnings of the paper. At the moment there is no real theoretical position.
- 5. The paper requires significant editing, as currently the standard of English expression including the translation of the quotations from the films - is not what one would expect in an English language refereed journal.

Reviewer: 2

Comments to the Author

- 1. This paper needs to consider academic writing and the journal writing style in terms of formulating ideas.
- 2. Formulating problems questioned should be clear to show the focus and contribution of the paper within the field of studies.
- 3. Try to consider SEA studies readers and not to be exclusive on Indonesian readers.
