Decision: Major revisions required

This manuscript introduces a study on the incorporation of Islamic values into Indonesian legislation. It presents a historical perspective on using religious values in lawmaking , particularly focusing on integrating Islamic principles throughout Indonesia 's history. The methodology , a "juridical normative approach , is briefly mentioned. The manuscript touches on the development of a creed driven by internalized Islamic values, which is said to contribute to adherence to Islam. The significance of Islam's influence on Indonesia's legal and political landscape is discussed. However,

- 1. The manuscript lacks clarity in connecting historical developments with the study's objectives and the implications of its findings.
- 2. The introduction outlines the historical context of Islamic law in Indonesia and its deep integration into the country's administrative and judicial systems. It highlights the process of internalizing Islamic values to form a creed that guides individuals toward Islam. The introduction must also suggest that such internalization strengthens religious adherence and spreads Islam. Additionally , the connection between politics and the Islamization of various regions needs to be briefly discussed . It could provide more clarity on the specific research gap and questions that the study addresses.
- 3. A theoretical framework section must introduce two prominent theories underpinning the internalization of Islamic values in Indonesian society and law. The explanation of the introduced theories could be more comprehensive.

- 4. This text's "Results" section provides a comprehensive overview of the internalization of Islamic values within Indonesian legislation. The authors delve into historical and socio-cultural contexts, highlighting how Islamic values have been integrated into the development of the Indonesian ational aw. However, this section must effectively discuss the contributions of Islamic values to legal quidance, administrative direction, and moral education within Indonesian society.
- 5. The "Discussion "section successfully connects the dots between the synergistic relationship between Islamic values and legislation in Indonesia. However, it would be beneficial to offer more explicit commentary on the implications of this synergy for Indonesian society.

Reviewer -B

Decision: Major revisions required

The authors have done an excellent job of conceiving this idea. It's a well-written paper. However, there is a need for improvement in some areas. For instance:

- 1. There is a need to derive relevant research questions from the theoretical framework, and should be aligned with the study's focus.
- 2. The methodological section adequately explains the choice of a juridical normative methodology for the study. However, briefly elaborating on why this methodology is suitable for investigating the internalization of Islamic values in legislation would enhance its relevance.
- 3. The literature review starts well by discussing the genesis of Islamic law in Indonesia. However, the transition between topics could be smoother. Consider using clear topic sentences to guide the reader through different aspects of the literature review. Expand on the impact of different ideologies on the development of Islamic law during the kingdom era. How did these ideologies shape legal thinking and practices? When discussing the Dutch colonial period, provide more context on how odewijk Willem Christian van den Berg and Christian Snouck Hurgronje 's theories affected the interaction between Islamic law and colonial governance.
- 4. The section on turning religious values into law is insightful, but it could benefit from a clearer distinction between religious values and legal regulations. Provide examples of specific values that were transformed into enforceable laws.
- 5. To make the literature review more cohesive, ensure that each point relates directly to the study's focus on the internalization of Islamic values in Indonesian legislation. Provide explicit connections between historical developments and their implications for Islamic values in lawmaking . Where possible , provide direct citations to scholarly sources that support the points made in the literature review.
